- are inviting and can be given to the child many times





PARENT TIPS

<p>1 - My Little Aeroplane</p> 	<p>Discuss aeroplanes and other forms of transport.</p> <p>Ask the child to compare aeroplanes to cars. Talk about the similarities and differences between cars and aeroplanes.</p>	<p>Provide empty cardboard boxes and rolls and ask the child to make an aeroplane. Talk about the shapes in the child's aeroplane.</p>
<p>2 - My Fluffy Sheep</p> 	<p>Sing a song about sheep e.g. Baa Baa Black Sheep.</p> <p>Talk about a sheep's soft coat and ask the child to name other things that feel soft to touch.</p>	<p>Go for a walk with the child and collect things from the park, beach or backyard. Spend time touching each thing and talk about how it feels.</p> <p>Ask the child to make groups of things that are smooth, rough, soft or hard.</p>
<p>3 - My Fancy Gifts</p> 	<p>Put a small chocolate, lolly or apple in a box as a gift to give to somebody. Ask the child to wrap the gift, decorate it and deliver it.</p>	<p>Look at a department store catalogue with the child. Name somebody familiar to the child and ask the child to circle possible gifts for that person.</p>
<p>4 - My Little Car</p> 	<p>Play "Spot The Car" while out driving or walking. Choose a colour and ask the child to say "spot it" each time they see a car of that colour.</p>	<p>Ask the child to make a car out of an empty tissue box. Suggest that he/she stick windows and wheels on the car.</p>
